To protect the Church from the lies of Satan by creating unity within the GMC under the guidance of Holy Spirit.


3. Describe some experiences that will be an advantage to your work as a General Conference delegate.

I was and still am very active in the local church though, I did not turn away from God at all, but these experiences helped me grow closer to Him.
- b. I serve on our church Serve and Response Team (SRT) which helps with projects and needs around the church, around the community, and with disaster response as well.
- c. I served as the Director of Outreach Ministries for several years. This allowed me several opportunities to go on mission trips. I have been to El Salvador, Costa Rica, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Haiti, and with the ZOE Ministry in Kenya. I have seen the needs of people around the world and understand that we need to understand the needs before just rushing in with our American ideas. I love that we are truly a global church.
- d. I currently lead a team of volunteers that make sure our shut-ins, those in rehab, and those in the hospital are visited. I do my best to visit with every person prior to their surgeries. I love seeing their faces when they arrive prior to surgery and see me there. Their demeanor changes from nervous, to being more relaxed and confident that God is with them.
- e. As I mentioned before, I was a schoolteacher. I taught mostly fourth grade. I loved interacting with my students and helping them to achieve. My last eight years were at a private Christian school. It was great to be able to share God in all the subjects. It allowed the students to see that God is in everything. Even before teaching at the Christian school I felt I made a positive impact on my students in the public schools. I would pray over my students' desk each morning before they arrived. I would read my Bible during our Drop Everything And Read (DEAR) time. It was especially rewarding that at the end of the school year, parents would come to me and ask me to pray for their child. I did not preach to nor share Christ with the students in the public school, during school, but somehow the parents knew.

My passion and fruit for sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ comes from my experiences in life. God has called me to do many things. At first I was so hesitant because they were WAY out of my comfort zone. But God showed me that He was with me ad would equip me in all that he called me to. Lifelong Methodist and servant leader.


